Dear Parish Family, Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen indeed! Alleluia!

This past week has been the sixth week since we closed the doors of the Cathedral – sometimes for me it feels a lot longer or a lot less than that! One thing I am very thankful for during this time is the unceasing work of prayer which is happening throughout the parish. It's wonderful to hear people's stories of praying Morning and Evening Prayer and joining in services online. They say it takes six weeks to make a habit, and I think praying the daily offices is a most commendable habit to form!



Some have asked me if I'm enjoying Sunday morning sleep-ins! I'll be honest – I'm not up as early as I would be on a normal Sunday morning, but I am up and dressed and in the Cathedral before 8 to spend the morning there. Firstly I light the candles, and pray Morning Prayer, then as I sit in the St Christopher chapel, I join in the online service. Following that, I spend time prayerfully walking around the Cathedral. As I pass each pew, or stand in different places like the entry, or the shop, or the choir, or the vestry, I visualise those who would be in that those places, and I pray for you.

This Sunday, I'll be especially praying for all for whom Mother's Day holds many memories and emotions.



The last thing I do in the Cathedral, before I extinguish the candles and leave to make a prayer walk around the outside of the Cathedral, is to tend the sanctuary lamps at the High Altar and the St Michael Chapel. Normally our wonderful vergers would maintain this ministry, trimming the wicks and refilling the lamps. The doors might be closed, but it's important to me that the

lamps are still burning. I have learnt that you can't rush this process, and it is a beautiful, meditative close to the morning. I think that this is a habit I'll be sad to break, and a job that will be difficult to give back!

Thank you again to those who have generously responded to the letter from the Parish Council last week. In this week's mailing there is a letter from Judy Wotton, our Parish Mission Secretary, highlighting the particular need of our mission partners. I encourage you to prayerfully respond as you are able. Please also pray for our Community Lunch ministry and all who are part of this vital outreach.

We are also physically mailing the pewsheet and these resources each week to those without internet access. If you know of anyone who would like to receive this by mail, please contact the Cathedral office.



From the Cathedral's Director of Music, Peter Guy...

In John's Gospel this morning we hear Jesus tell his disciples that he is the way, the truth and the life. It is arguably the most famous of John's "I am" sayings, and serves as the inspiration for the poem "The Call" by Anglican Priest and Poet, George Herbert (1593-1663). Herbert had served as Cambridge University's "Public Orator" and would later be elected to Parliament, anticipating for himself a distinguished political career. However the death of King James I, some important patrons, and his mother caused him to re-focus his life, albeit against the objections of his friends who deemed that being a pastor was beneath him!

Herbert died of Tuberculosis at the tender age of 40, at which time none of his poems had been published. He gave a collection of his poems to his friend on his deathbed in the hope they might help "any dejected poor soul". Herbert is now considered one of the most important poets of his day!

Ralph Vaughan Williams (at the time an atheist before settling into "cheerful agnosticism") wrote a collection of works for the The Three Choirs Festival in Worcester, 1911. The setting takes 5 of Herbert's poems and arranges them for baritone soloist and orchestra, with optional choir for the first and last movements. "The Call" (the fourth movement) is set simply, with the baritone soloist underpinned by slow-moving chords. The setting is as simple and sublime as the poem itself.

I arranged this work many years ago (too many years to count!), and was fortunate that the choir were happy to perform it while we were on tour in the UK in 2016. I hope that you will enjoy that performance, heard here: <u>https://youtu.be/wSLMkP4304U</u>

St Aidan's Land Sale Trust – A recent special Board Meeting passed a resolution, ratified by Parish Council, to seek approval from Diocesan Council to withdraw an amount of \$60,816 from the St Aidan's Land Sale Trust in order to discharge the loan for the Darby St unit and to pay debts for some parish properties, including historic rate expenses.
